Foster Child Progress In Home:

11/4/2007 - 11/10/2007 Client is doing well. He got his hair cut much shorter than it has been and Foster mother is very proud of the way he looks. Client said that he still doesn't like it, that it's too short. Client went to church with Foster mother's son on Sunday! Foster mother was very surprised and excited about this. Client has gone to church with his brother before but said that he didn't like it. Client told Foster mother that he liked this church much better. Foster mother said that last night Client was very talkative and almost hyper. She said that he just kept talking about school and saying that he really likes it better than middle school.

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Discipline Issues (According to Foster Child and According to Foster Parent):

11/4/2007 - 11/10/2007 There have been no discipline issues this week according to Foster mother and Client. Foster mother said that Client is doing very well with keeping his curfew. He remembers to call even if he is going to be about 10 minutes late. Foster mother is very impressed with this obvious progress.

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Biological Family Issues/Visitation:

Notes Client does not have contact with his biological mother due to TPR which was granted on 11-29-06. Mother has put in an appeal to TPR and state worker has advised that the case is finally set to be heard on the September docket and a ruling hopefully to be made by the end of October. Client's dad signed a voluntary TPR so that he could continue visitation with client and his brother. Client's father has a habit of calling at the last minute and expecting Foster mother to rearrange everything in order to fit his schedule. She has done this multiple times since she knows it is important for the boys to see their father; however, it has been quite frustrating.

11/4/2007 - 11/10/2007 Client heard from his dad that he hired a detective to find Client's brother. His dad discovered that Client's mom has moved back to Anytown and back in with boyfriend, Client's step-dad. Brother is back in Othertown as well, working as a chef in a restaurant. Client said that he didn't really enjoy the family reunion in Thisstate because he hardly knew anyone there. Client and his brother would like to go camping with their dad and other brother on Labor Day weekend. Foster mother will let me know as soon as she knows the nights they'll be gone and where they're going.

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School/Vocational Issues:

Notes Client is in his freshman year (9th grade) at This County High School in This County, City, State. He is in regular classes. In past years, Client has struggled academically, but likely due to a lack of motivation rather than a lack of ability. He has already begun the year well.

11/4/2007 - 11/10/2007 Client said that school is going well. He has been in a pretty good mood about school since it began one week ago, according to Foster mother. Client said that it's much better than middle school. He described it as in some ways being harder but at the same time being easier. Client had complained about his speech / debate class and Foster mother took him to school this morning but wasn't able to speak with the counselor. Client talked with the counselor today and found out that it's too late to drop the class. He said that it's alright though; he already gave a speech and seemed to enjoy it. Client has said that he doesn't have any homework since school began, but Foster mother will stay on him so that this year can start off much better than the last.

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Therapy/Psychiatry Issues:

Notes Client has officially been discharged from therapy with therapist. Their last session was on 4-11-07. Therapist documented that client met his goals for therapy no longer needs regular individual therapy (see document in file). Since client is not a therapeutic foster child (his LOC is 2) and is not taking any psychotropic medication, Client's Treatment Team made the decision that he would not need ongoing psychiatric services. Therapy with therapist and - or psychiatric care will remain available for client should the need arise.

11/4/2007 - 11/10/2007 Client has been discharged from therapy.

Medical/Dental/Optical Issues:

Notes Client is on Prozac. 30 Milligrams every eight hours.

11/4/2007 - 11/10/2007 Client is current on all medical appointments.

Cultural Issues:

11/4/2007 - 11/10/2007 I reminded Foster mother about Client's cultural activity. She will likely discuss with him their trip to the beach. They will do one more activity this quarter to make up for the last.

Independent Living Issues:

11/4/2007 - 11/10/2007 Client has been very helpful around the house. Foster mother said that he is even helping out some with the laundry, so she doesn't have to lug his clothes downstairs by herself.

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Court Involvement:

There have been no court involvements reported to Case Manager this month.

Recent Critical Incidents:

There have been no critical incidents reported to Case Manager this month.

After Care Plan:

Adoption. TPR has occurred; however, biological mother has put in an appeal to the TPR decision. According to State Worker, nothing can be done to move towards adoption until the appeal process is finalized. State worker had informed Foster parent that the case was set to be heard on the September docket and a ruling hopefully to be made by the end of October. However, as of yet, no ruling has been made. Current Foster mother is planning to adopt Client and his brother, who have both been in her home for just over 2 years.

Treatment Plan Effective Date: 9/13/2007

Treatment Plan Progress:

Goal 1:

Nathan will not be withdrawn and will learn to manage issues surrounding abuse in a healthy manner.

Nathan has done very well on this objective and has made a lot of progress. He is doing much more with his peers, including practicing for lacrosse and working with a friend in his elderly neighbor's yard. Nathan has also become very open with his Foster mother.

Goal 2:

Nathan will learn Housing and Money Management skills.

Nathan has been learning a lot about credit: the pros and cons, and maintaining a good credit rating. Nathan has not yet begun his mock budget. Nathan just completed his Independent Living Assessment which will be tallied and scored.

Goal 3:

Nathan will attain an understanding of adoption and find comfort in being adopted.

Nathan has successfully completed this goal.
